Hello Northwest Chapter!

In December, the Northwest Chapter announced plans for the 2024 Professional Development Conference on Tuesday, February 13, 2024 at 3M's Innovation Center in Maplewood, MN. We now want you to know that PDC <u>registrations</u> are now open, and you will not want to miss the opportunity. Let's gather for an exciting day!

With a theme of "Innovating Safety in 2024", we have put together a full day of general sessions and breakout sessions featuring subject matter experts with "innovative" presentations that will help you improve as an EHS Professional. Don't forget the networking opportunities! With an Exhibitor Area and a schedule providing plenty of time to meet and greet, you will expand your network and re-kindle connections.

As a special PDC feature, our schedule includes two options to participate in a tour of the 3M Innovation Center; one during the Morning Breakouts, and the other during the Afternoon Breakouts. If you have never seen the Innovation Center and heard the story of 3M, you won't want to miss this. Here's a very important detail concerning the tours: we have a limit to the number of people who can participate in the tours and these slots are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. This means you should not delay your PDC registration if you want to get in on one of these tours.

The <u>registration</u> cost for the PDC is \$200.00 and this provides for the full-day conference schedule, the Exhibition Area, continental breakfast, buffet lunch, and the Innovation Center tours. More information and the ability for online registration is located at the Northwest Chapter website. Keep in mind that your organization may want to get involved as a PDC Sponsor. Attention All Students! The Northwest Chapter ASSP 2024 Scholarship Program is Here!

Multiple Scholarships totaling \$4000 available for students pursuing a graduate degree, Master of Science in Risk Control, at University of Wisconsin-Stout, Master of Environmental Health & Safety, at the University of Minnesota-Duluth or Master or Doctorate in Public Health or an Occupational Safety, Health or Environmental field of study at the University of Minnesota.

Due dates for your application to be considered are as follows:

 US Postal Users must have their application postmarked by March 13th, 2024

- Last minute filers must deliver their application in person or as a PDF file via email no later than 4:30 pm CDT on Friday March 15th, 2024.
- Email users note...It is not 100% certain that your email will successfully make it to your intended addressee. Please consider using the US Postal system.

Criteria for 2024 Scholarship Awards

- Incomplete or late applications will be disqualified.
- Applicants must be currently enrolled full-time, and plan to graduate in May 2024 or later to be eligible for this award.
- Previous recipients of Northwest Chapter ASSP scholarship awards are not eligible.
- Applicants must complete Section I of the application form and attach a Scholarship Award Essay.
- Applicants must attach a current resume to the scholarship award application.
- Applicants must submit transcripts from completed graduate courses and undergraduate degree programs. The transcripts must:
 - Verify good academic standing.
 - Verify overall graduate GPA of at least 3.25 out of a 4.0 system for all graduate courses completed.
 - Verify undergraduate degree completion and an overall undergraduate GPA of at least 2.75 out of a 4.0 system.
- Unofficial transcripts are accepted by following ASSP's Code of Professional Conduct
- Section II of the application form and a reference letter from a university program faculty member must accompany scholarship application. The letter must:
 - Include verification of official enrollment in an occupational safety & health or closely related field.
 - Verify 6 current semester hours or more.

Eligibility for all Northwest Chapter ASSP scholarships requires a current ASSP student membership that costs \$15 per year. To apply for membership, contact ASSP's Customer Service department at 847-699-2929 or visit ASSP's web site at www.assp.org.
