



#### Government Affairs Update: Federal OSHA MAkes Changes to Regions

In a News Release dated May 8, 2024, Federal OSHA has announced a restructuring of their Regions across the United States. Changes include: A new Region Office was created, based out of Birmingham, AL, and Regions 9 and 10 were merged into a new Region based out of San Francisco. The boundaries of Region 5 and Region 8 - which cover the States that include Northwest Chapter Members - remain the same. Perhaps the biggest change for us is that Regions are no longer known by numbers; they are now named after a major city within the Region. For us that means Region 5 is now known as the "Chicago Region" and Region 8 is now known as the "Denver Region".
