On December 9 the Northwest Chapter held the monthly meeting at the Minnesota Safety Council in St. Paul. It was a great time for networking and learning, with a special presentation by Cathy Hovde, CIH, CSP, of Resilient EHS who delivered a program called, "What's That Smell? Industrial Hygiene Made Simple". This was a great, high-level message that provided a lot of insights into the world of industrial hygiene that are important to remember, whether you are a veteran CIH or if you are occasionally involved in industrial hygiene-related tasks. As part of this meeting, we initiated a food and cash drive to support the efforts of Second Harvest Heartland. We had a large box of food donations brought to the meeting, plus we have received \$160.00 in cash donations.

The next meeting is the annual joint meeting with AIHA and takes place Tuesday, January 20, 2026 at the Minnesota Air National Guard base.
